Call to Order: Chair Boston called the meeting to order at 4:03 pm.

Roll Call of Commission Members: Chair Boston, Vice-Chair Masters, Commissioner Bennett, and Commissioner Eichelberger are present.

1. **Consent Calendar**

- a. Motion to approve the special meeting minutes of January 25, 2018 by Vice-Chair Masters and seconded by Commissioner Eichelberger. Motion carries and minutes are approved.

2. **New Business**

- a. NAPC Camp Program – Discussion ensued about the Camp Information and e-mail from Pete L'Orange...discussion ensued. Chair Eichelberger volunteered to follow up on the camp with Pete and the CAMP folks as well.
- b. Possible Collaborative Projects with the Hayden Arts Commission – Chair Boston spoke about the placement of a historical sign probably at Chomper's. Commissioner Eichelberger recapped the grant that the Historic Preservation Commission received from Farm Bureau Service for interpretative signage for about \$750. The Commission believes that the verbiage is nearing completion, but believes that the Arts Commission may have a better sense of aesthetics or maybe some branding. Chair Sorenson of the Arts Commission said that they had helped with something like that for the dog park at Croffoot Park. Commissioner Eichelberger noted that it would have to be ADA compliant. Design ideas, funding ideas. Vice-Chair Masters noted that the font should be the same; the City Logo should be present.
- c. 2018 Idaho Archaeology and Historic Preservation Month – May 2018;
Theme is "Storytelling" – Second Annual Storytelling event – Chair Eichelberger gave a recap of what has happened in the past. Vice-chair Masters gave examples of how folks dressed up in period wear and portrayed the individual that had died. They had a bagpipe that played during the event. Discussion went to the Rimrock Cemetery and whether we could host an event similar. Chair Eichelberger to follow up with Pete L'Orange.
